The untold story that **CHANGED THE HISTORY BOOKS.**

Most Americans simply don't know that it was the decisive victory at Saratoga that enabled Ambassador Benjamin Franklin, after numerous unsuccessful attempts, to convince the French crown to intervene in the American Revolution—thus transforming this colonial conflict from a rebellious insurrection to a wider, world war. Burgoyne's defeat at Saratoga alone made this first American diplomatic triumph possible. **Saratoga was the lynchpin to bringing the French into the fight** and the birth of the Franco-American Alliance.

No film has been made to date that focuses on the singular importance of the Battles of Saratoga to America's successful fight for independence. *Why doesn't this most pivotal of battles enjoy the attention that is given to the other seminal moments in American history? Why is Saratoga given short shrift in history courses and books?* Well, only we can change that.

This veteran-owned project is dedicated to bringing the compelling story of how victories at Bennington and Saratoga kept the sacred flame from being extinguished during one of the darkest hours of the American War for Independence.

THE STORY

THE TURNING POINT OF THE REVOLUTION

The Battles of Saratoga is one of the most important battles ever fought in world history.

In 1777, the American Revolution was on the brink of collapse. The British army delivered crushing defeats to the Continental Army and controlled Canada to the North and New York to the South. They devised a plan to link forces in Albany and crush the rebellion once and for all.

With a renewed vigor, militias from all across New England and New

York converged and poured in to a small town along the Hudson River... Saratoga.

In a miraculous event, the Americans delivered a stunning defeat to the British. For the first time, the mightiest army in the world had surrendered to the newest. Ceremoniously, British General John Burgoyne was forced to hand over his sword to American General Horatio Gates.

The Battles of Saratoga became known as, *"The Turning Point of the American Revolution."*

THE MASSACRE *of Jane McCrea*

Jane McCrea (sometimes spelled McCrae or MacCrae, 1752-1777) was a young woman who was purportedly slain by Native Americans associated with the British army of Lieutenant General John Burgoyne during the American Revolutionary War. Affianced to a Loyalist serving in Burgoyne's army, her slaying led to expressions of outrage and an increase in Patriot military recruiting, especially in the days following her killing.

The propaganda that followed greatly accentuated her beauty, and the fact that she was associated with Loyalists (although her family was primarily active in serving the Patriot cause) undermined British claims of protection for Loyalists. Burgoyne's inability to punish the alleged killers also undermined British assertions that they were more civilized in their conduct of the war; the dissemination of this propaganda contributed to the success of Patriot recruiting drives in New York for several years.



THE BURIAL OF

After the Battles of Saratoga, 1777

During the Seven Years War (1756-1763), Simon Fraser fought at the Siege of Louisbourg and at Quebec under the command of Major-General James Wolfe. A near-relation of a former Jacobite chieftain, he went to North America in 1776, commanding a brigade in the army of Major-General John Burgoyne during the American War of Independence (1775-1783).

The following year, Burgoyne allowed his army to be encircled by superior American forces at Saratoga. During an unsuccessful attempt to break through the American position, Fraser was mortally wounded by a rifle ball on 7, October 1777 on the ground called Bemus Heights. He died at 8 o'clock the following morning and was buried in one of the British redoubts. After this battle, over 5,000 of Burgoyne's troops were subsequently forced to surrender to the Americans, which marked a turning point in the war.



Colonel Morgan's RIFLEMEN

Morgan's Sharpshooters, also known as Morgan's Riflemen or Morgan's Rifles led by Colonel Daniel Morgan, were a decisive force in the American Revolutionary War. Armed with advanced long rifles, such as the Pennsylvania or Kentucky rifles, they boasted a doubled effective range compared to standard muskets, marking them as elite light infantry.

Diverging from the norm, Morgan's Sharpshooters wore hunting shirts instead of traditional military uniforms, signaling their departure from conventional warfare. Their distinctive appearance foreshadowed their unorthodox hit-and-run guerrilla tactics.

Under Morgan's command, the Provisional Rifle Corps became a formidable entity within the northern army led by Gen. Horatio Gates. Executing rapid and successful attacks on British-aligned Indian allies, these unpredictable skirmishes confounded British intelligence, providing a crucial strategic edge to the American forces.

Morgan's Sharpshooters' impact unfolded in the Battle of Bemis Heights and the Battle of Saratoga. They not only drove back advancing British units but orchestrated a pivotal right flank attack, compelling a decisive British retreat. Their effectiveness in these engagements underscored their pivotal role in the overall success of the American forces during the Revolutionary War.



THE FRENCH-AMERICAN ALLIANCE



FRENCH NAVY SHIPS IN ACTION IN THE BATTLE OF THE CHESAPEAKE

A crucial battle that took place near the mouth of Chesapeake Bay on September 5, 1781, just prior to the decisive American victory at Yorktown. This necessary French support – ground & naval – was made possible by the providential victory at Saratoga in October 1777.

The seismic victory at Saratoga proved to be the decisive turning point of the Revolutionary War as it enabled Benjamin Franklin to finally persuade the French crown to militarily support the American cause.

Burgoyne's surrender at Saratoga, coupled with the prior American victories at Fort Stanwix and Bennington, led directly to the alliances between the United States and France as well as with the Netherlands which ultimately financed much of the new nation's debts. On December 6, 1777, Charles Gravier, comte de Vergennes, the French Foreign Minister, agreed to the American

request for a military alliance in the wake of the victory at Saratoga. The Franco-American Treaty of Amity and Commerce and the Treaty of Alliance were signed in Paris on February 6, 1778 by Comte de Vergennes and an American delegation comprised of Benjamin Franklin, Arthur Lee, and Silas Deane. Both treaties were ultimately approved by King Louis XVI in early March 1778.

Most notably, on March 13, 1778, the French minister in London informed King George III that France recognized the United States as an independent and sovereign nation.

Saratoga & Yorktown

VICTORIES FOREVER LINKED.

When General Charles Cornwallis surrendered at Yorktown on October 19, 1781, more than half of General George Washington's total force strength was comprised of French ground (led by Marshal Jean-Baptiste Donatien de Vimeur, comte de Rochambeau) and naval support (under the command of François Joseph Paul, comte de Grasse). This strategic support was made possible solely by the decisive victory at Saratoga four years earlier on October 17, 1777. Less than two years later, the American Revolutionary War was formally ended, with the signing of The Treaty of Paris on September 3, 1783.

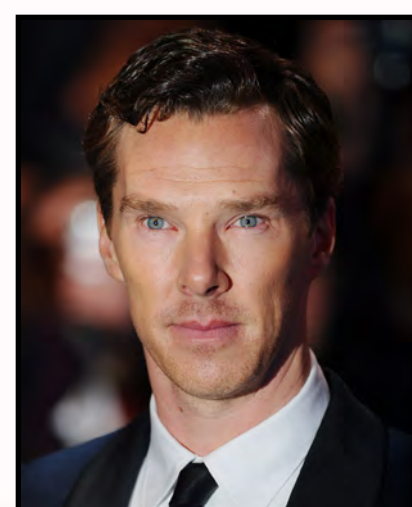


General John Burgoyne

form New York's "Turning Point Trail" (part of the state's storied "Path Through History").

This trail – consisting of Fort Ticonderoga, whose cannons were used to end the protracted Boston Siege in March 1776 – which strategically commands unrivaled vistas of the majestic Champlain Valley, the Adirondack High Peaks and the Green Mountains; Walloomsac, NY, actual site of the Battle of Bennington (where Burgoyne's foraging force was routed in August 1777, a harbinger of the ultimate outcome of his ill-fated campaign); and, the Saratoga National Historical Park, site of the war's decisive turning point – marks the geographic region of one of the most consequential chapters of the American Revolution.
